COLUMBIA RIVER ACTION NOTICE	
Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife	May 11, 2022
The following actions were taken:	
<i>2022 Mainstem Columbia River Spring Chinook Recreational Fishery</i>	
Downstream of Bonneville Dam	
Season:	Thursday May 12 through Sunday May 22, and June 4-15 23 retention days
Area:	Tongue Point/Rocky Point line upstream to Beacon Rock (boat and bank) plus bank angling only from Beacon Rock upstream to the Bonneville Dam deadline. Legal upstream boat boundary defined as: A deadline marker on the Oregon bank (approximately four miles downstream from Bonneville Dam Powerhouse One) in a straight line through the western tip of Pierce Island to a deadline marker on the Washington bank at Beacon Rock.
Daily Bag Limit:	Two adult hatchery salmonids (Chinook or steelhead) per day, but only one may be a Chinook. Shad may also be retained.
Limit:	All other permanent regulations apply.

FUTURE MEETINGS

- A Compact/Joint State hearing is scheduled for 2 PM Wednesday, May 18, 2022 to consider additional non-treaty spring Chinook fisheries.
